Hatteberg and HCC soccer

KAKE-TV's Larry Hatteberg kicks off our November meetings, followed by Hutchinson Community College's Women's Soccer coach Sammy Lane.

On **Nov. 7**, **Larry Hatteberg**, co-anchor for KAKE News at Five, will be our guest speaker.

Larry Hatteberg is a name synonymous with the highest quality television journalism. He began his 41-year television career with KAKE in 1963, and immediately distinguished himself with his ability to communicate visually, letting his subjects tell their story.

Larry has received more than 100 local, state and national awards for news photography and reporting and is Kansas' most honored journalist. His "Hatteberg's People" series is the longest running television feature in Kansas. His book, "Larry Hatteberg's Kansas People" spent weeks on the state's best-selling list. He's held nearly every position in the KAKE newsroom, and currently co-anchors KAKE News at Five.

Larry grew up in Winfield, Kan., and graduated from Winfield High School. He attended Kansas State

Teachers College and Wichita State University before starting at KAKE. Larry's wife, Judy, is a writer and teacher. They have two daughters, Sherry and Susan.

Lane was hired to be HCC's first soccer coach in January. His inaugural class of Lady Dragons has 17 players, all from the state of Kansas, including five from Hutchinson/Reno County and seven from Wichita.

Lane is a native of Ireland. After graduating from high school, he came to America to play soccer at Sterling College where he played

all four years as a goalkeeper, earning all-Kansas Collegiate Athletic Conference (KCAC) honors three times.

Sterling College lost only two KCAC games from 1986-88, going undefeated in 1987. Lane, who also played tennis at Sterling, was voted Most Valuable Player in 1986 by both his soccer team and the KCAC.

He graduated in 1991 with a degree in business administration.

From 1993 to 1998 Lane played for the Wichita Wings as the back-up goalkeeper. He served as assistant coach for the Wings from 1998 to 2001, the youngest assistant coach in the National Professional Soccer League.

In 1996 and 1997 Lane was the head women's soccer coach for McPherson College, until the school dropped soccer in 1998.

He and his wife, Amber, live in Wichita.
